With support from HealthierHere, organizations across King County have come together to design, develop and launch the Connect2 Community Network to improve information sharing and collaboration.



The Connect2 Community Network is built on relationships and enabled by technology. Social service, community, tribal, government, physical and behavioral health organizations gather to deepen trust and work towards the common goal of health equity. Functionalities that streamline collaboration and information sharing support this vision.

Community members are at the center of this work. Connect2 Community Network partners prioritize the needs of the communities most affected by health disparities and systemic oppression.
