

Online Meeting Minutes: April 18, 2023

Guest Speaker: The Garage, Teen Café Tiana Perry & Jocelyn Skillman

- The Garage first opened in 2018 and initially saw 15-30 students per day, quickly growing to 50. Now, the Garage is serving 100-150 students per day.
- The Garage is open to any high school aged teen, regardless of where they live, if they are enrolled in school or not / home schooled / attend any high school. Typically this means ages 13-18. Low barrier proof of age is requested when first attending
- Everything at the Garage is FREE snacks/food, art supplies, use of musical instruments, mental health counseling, case management services, and much more
- The Garage is a teen-led environment where all activities within the Garage originate with teens, and staff provide support to help execute the plans
- There are multiple ways teens can provide input to staff: monthly listening sessions, join Teens 4 Teens committee, join Teen Advisory Board
- All teens agree to a participation agreement that invites all teens to follow guidelines for safety, and responsible contributions like recycling
- Free drop-In mental health services are provided for free 5 days/week between 2 mental health professionals. Last year the Garage hired mental health professionals, in the past collaborated with Friends of Youth counselors.
- Free case management services are also available to any youth, ages 12-19. This is a larger age span than the Garage regular students, so families can engage with Garage case managers.
- Blackthorn Haven program development is progressing, providing case management to teens who are experiencing homelessness or are at-risk, and will soon be able to open Host Home program in Issaquah area.
- A 2nd Garage location in Sammamish is under development, with plans for 2023-2024 school year. The Garage staff are recruiting for a Sammamish Teens 4 Teens committee to be part of the new location's development.
- Upcoming Community Events:
 - April 19: Teen panel discusses the importance of creative outlets
 - May TBD: Teen panel discussing how to be an ally to the LGBTQ+ community
 - June 24: Garage Pride event, bigger than prior years. This teen-planned event is open to the community
