- The Cultural and Family Partnership department is now combined with Counseling and Student Well-Being
- The mission is to eliminate barriers for students and their families, including those that are new to the American school system
- ISD had approximately 4,000 non-English speaking students I n 2018, and the number has increased since then.
- There are over 82 languages spoken in the homes of ISD students, with 24 preferred languages, with Spanish, Chinese and Korean being the top 3.
- Cultural and Family Partnership provides for interpreters for all languages
- C&FP focuses on equity across the district, and is part of Executive Limitations 16: School Board adopted EL-16 to ensure an environment and culture that values and respects the diversity of its students and staff, addressing factors affecting student achievement and wellbeing.
- ISD website has a link to a cultural calendar available for staff and families for planning for student learning. Staff and families are encouraged to call school with excused absences for cultural reasons. https://www.isd411.org/about-us/equity/religion-and-culture
- The C&FP team hold events throughout the school year, and the calendar of events can be found on the website https://www.isd411.org/programs-services/equity/parent-events-and-workshops
- Right now, currently enrolling students for the 2023-2024 school year.
- There are Liaisons assigned to each school feeder pattern (Issaquah, Skyline, Liberty)
- Liaisons support families by connecting them with resources for food, clothing, legal services and more
- Ask for INN: how to connect with community resources for clothing for older students and adults, as well as household items (beds, desks, chairs, etc). There is no location in Issaquah for families to find these resources. Discussion on connecting with The Circle.

- City of Issaquah Heat Information Update: There have been no other changes to our approach or protocols. We are having city wide daily meetings to determine if the conditions have changed and if our approach needs to change. We are still in a category "Major" level three of four, so we are still encouraging people to stay cool in public locations such as the Library, Sr. Center and Rec. Center and we will hand out water. If we move to "extreme" category, level four of four, we will offer overnight cooling centers. If this changes we will provide messaging to our local non-profits and community partners.
