

Online Meeting Minutes: Sept 20, 2022

Guest Speaker #1: City of Sammamish, Human Services, Rita Badh rbadh@sammamish.us

- Rita has been with the City for 5 years, the start of the Human Services Dept
- In 2018, the City did a Needs Assessment survey to identify community priorities as well as establish the Grants program.
 - o Housing: 25% of households were cost-burdened
 - Transportation: many lived far from Metro stops
 - Priorities: mental wellness, basic needs (housing, food, medical care, etc), cultural inclusion, seniors, domestic violence
 - In 2021 Commission Learning to understand the impact of pandemic, and focus on current needs

Guest Speaker #2: Friends of Echo Glen, Susan susan@echoglen.org www.echoglen.org

- Susan has been a volunteer at Echo Glen for 23 years
- Echo Glen is one of two juvenile detention facilities in WA state, and is now under the purview of Dept of Children, Youth & Families. Echo Glen is the only facility for female youth, and also houses some young male youth. Green Hills is the 2nd facility and houses older males
- Recent change in laws provides that youth may stay at Echo Glen through age 25, and continue to receive the services not offered at facilities for adults. Some residents have been as young as 12 years old
- For those under the age of 18, Issaquah School District provides education
- Also available are online resources for GED completion as well as college courses
- There are currently 85 residents at Echo Glen. When Susan started, there were almost 200 residents
- Covid has had a huge impact to everyone at Echo Glen including staff and volunteers.
- Residents arrive with various levels of trauma, but all have experienced trauma. Services provide for mental health as well as other supports
- Currently, facing challenges due to low staffing levels, with some staff needing to work double shifts. These staffing levels also impact safety and support services, as well as morale for everyone
- How the community can help -
 - Donations for staff recognition and appreciation (gift cards for gas, restaurants, etc), as well as 2nd
 Shift Bags (snacks, cards, treats)
 - Share the open employment opportunities from the website
 - Volunteer provide empathy and a listening ear for the youth. Many opportunities through the many programs (cooking, gardening, art, life skills). There is also a mentor program with a commitment of weekly visits for a set number of weeks.
 - Donations for Holiday gifts. This program is coordinated by a volunteer, gift cards are best option.
 Each resident receives gifts.
