- **Kindering** will be at the Issaquah Food Bank next week Monday April 8th from 12:30pm-3:00pm. Families in Transition (FIT) Kindering
- Lifeline Phone Provider April 8th-11th 1:30pm-3:30pm Issaquah Food Bank will have Access Wireless for anyone that would like to complete a new application. Please note this is only for our neighbors that haven't applied or had a Lifeline phone in the past 6 months. If someone has a Lifeline services , is living unhoused and needs help navigating getting a replacement phone or other troubleshooting support please feel free to have them come by the Issaquah Food Bank during our program weeks Monday-Thursday between 9am and 3:00pm and meet with one of our wonderful Client Service Volunteers.
- Mobile DSHS office at Issaquah Food Bank Monday April 8th from 11:30AM-3:30PM. DSHS Mobile Office process new applications, reviews, and changes for active cases; they issue EBT cards and receive documents. 13. **Issaquah School District Healthy Youth Survey Results Available** Many Washington school districts like Issaquah voluntarily administer the anonymous survey to 6th, 8th, 10th, and 12th grade students in October. In the fall of 2023, the survey was administered between Oct. 9 and 24. The survey includes questions related to physical activity and diet, unintentional and intentional injury, substance use, risk and protective factors, access to school-based services, and sexual behaviors, abuse, and orientation. Results are used by schools, communities, and state agencies to plan programs to support our youth and reduce their risk

Affordable Connectivity Program The ACP is a U.S. government program run by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program to help low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet. The Affordable Connectivity Program is currently set to wind down in May. More than 77,000 households in King County could see their internet bills go up in May when the federal ACP runs out of money. Households have options for continuing service and switching plans, but must communicate with their internet provider to choose and confirm a continuing internet service plan and costs when the discount ends...or to ensure they end their service plan with a company if they want to. King County Metro is planning for the future of its paratransit rideshare service, Access Transportation. This project is called Future of Paratransit and will shape the service for the next five to ten years. Metro is looking for those interested in having a role in this project to take part in the Future of Paratransit Mobility Board. Members of the Future of Paratransit Mobility Board are paid for their participation, a stipend of \$75 an hour for their time, expertise, and any related transportation costs.
