3. **ParentWiser:** <u>The Parent Compass: Navigating your Child's Wellness and Academic</u> <u>Journey</u> Wed, Feb 7, 2024 7:00 - 8:15pm Navigating a competitive academic environment is one of the biggest stressors for teens and their parents. 4. <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> Enrollments End February 7, 2024 The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program run by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program to help low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet. You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch. ACP has replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit program.

#### 5. NAMI Eastside: Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training Feb 10 & 11, 2024 at

**Together Center** Mental Health First Aid is a course that teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training gives you the skills you need to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis. There is a 2 hour self study portion which needs to be completed at least 3 days prior to the class.

When a family qualifies for subsidy benefits and chooses a provider, the state pays a portion of the cost of childcare. Parents may be responsible for a copayment to their provider each month. Families experiencing homelessness may be approved for up to 12 months to help resolve issues surrounding homelessness.
