

Together we provide: <u>Housing & Homeless Services</u> (shelter, housing and eviction prevention), <u>Young Adult Services</u> (violence prevention, education, training, and employment), <u>Behavioral Health</u> (counseling, substance use treatment, and crisis intervention), and <u>Foster Care</u> (foster home licensing, and services for youth currently in and young adults aging out of the foster care system).



Host Homes

- Who: Youth and young adults, ages 12 24 that meet HUD categories 1, 2 or 4 definitions of homelessness.
- What: Up to six months of temporary housing with traditional or kinship hosts and case management support. Hosts can receive a monthly stipend to offset hosting costs.
- Kinship (Ages 12-24): Youth has identified a supportive adult in their life who is willing to temporarily host them. Must be a non-parent/guardian.





Host Homes (Cont.)

- Traditional (Ages 18-24): Young adult is paired with a Host in the community who will provide them with room & board for six months as they receive CM support and focus on securing permanent housing.
- Where: Throughout King County.
- How: Community referrals to <u>Andrew Donnelly</u> or <u>Tsega Amare</u>
